On the fifth of October, Secretary of Defense Mattis sent out guidance that emphasized the continued development of challenges from North Korea, China, Russia, Iran and violent extremism. These actors present a varied challenge to global security from direct technologically advanced influence to low intensity asymmetric warfare. It presents a complex security environment that demands we be capable of defending the nation with broad skill sets.

To that end, he outlined three focus areas; Restore military readiness, strengthen alliances and attract new partners and bring business reforms to DoD. We take a direct part in the first two areas. We do them well, and our success in them has not been more important in the last twenty years than it is now.

We continue to train and find new ways to be more efficient in how we prepare to do our war time mission. I'm proud of the work we've done, and there is more to do. Right now, we have over a hundred of our members deployed to the fight, doing their jobs and doing them well. We all are only a phone call away from being abruptly thrown into that role. We intend to make every UTA productive so the wing can be ready. It's up to all of us to make sure we are taking full advantage of the time we have here.

We continue to work with NATO allies and strengthen our relationships. Our joint training will be critical should we find ourselves fighting alongside them. There are other opportunities to work with foreign and joint US partners over the course of the year. We need to take advantage of them. By the nature of what we do, we will never be out working without being a part of a team that will include other Guard, Active Duty, sister service and international partners. We need to train with them now to be prepared when it counts.

I'm proud of what we have achieved. The initiative and dedication it takes to be as good as we are while living full lives with families, civilian careers, schooling, and all of the other elements that make us different than the full time force is inspiring. Keep demanding excellence from yourself and your team. Know we are needed and know that when we are needed to go, we will be ready.
